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## 1.0 Introduction

# 1.1 RFP Purpose

The Childcare Services Committee (CSC) of the Estes Park Economic Development Corporation (Estes Park EDC) is seeking a qualified Consultant to partner with local organizations to develop an actionable, statistically-valid Childcare Needs Assessment.

# 1.2 Background

The Estes Valley is located roughly 75 miles northwest of Denver, CO. The Valley is comprised of the town of Estes Park (the largest, and only incorporated, community), Glen Haven, Drake, Allenspark, and Pinewood Springs. The estimated population of the Estes Valley is 15,000 full-time residents. For the purposes of this RFP, the Estes Valley geographic area is the same as the Estes Park School District R-3 boundaries. The Estes Valley has a tourism-based economy with Rocky Mountain National Park serving as the primary attraction. The tourism industry is a major employer in the Valley

There is an anecdotally-identified lack of childcare options in the community.

Currently there are no licensed early childcare education centers that provide care to children under 2 ½ years old.

Current licensed care includes:

- Six (6) Family Childcare Homes (slots: 8 for infant; 12 for toddler; 24 for ages 2.5+)
- Two Full-Day Childcare Centers (slots: 41 for ages 2.5+; 18 for ages 3+)
- Two Part-Day, Partial-Week, Preschool Only Programs (slots: 79 for ages 2.5+ with some restrictions)
- Two After-School Programs (slots: 24 for ages K+)

#### 1.3 Goal

The goal of this project is to complete a statistically-valid Childcare Needs Assessment that accurately describes and quantifies the childcare needs and strengths of the Estes Valley, and provides recommended solutions for meeting gaps in the provision of high-quality, affordable early childhood education/childcare services to all children aged 0-5 in the Estes Valley.

# 1.4 Coverage and Participation

Proposals submitted in response to this RFP shall be for providing all professional services necessary for the completion of an actionable, statistically-valid Childcare Needs Assessment.

## 2.1 Original RFP Document

EVICS and the Estes Park EDC shall retain the submittals, and all related terms and conditions, exhibits, and other attachments, in original form in an archival copy. Any modification of these in any of the Consultant's submissions is grounds for immediate disqualification.

# 3.0 Scope of Work

# 3.1 Project Overview

This RFP contains the instructions governing the proposals to be submitted. It is the intent of the CSC to partner with the Consultant to develop an actionable, statistically-valid Childcare Needs Assessment.

#### 3.2 Coordination

The selected Consultant is to work in conjunction with the CSC and other designated community partners to develop the Childcare Needs Assessment. A transparent and open assessment process is expected. Designated community partners include, but are not limited to:

# 3.3 Types of Services

Provide the CSC with a comprehensive report detailing the supply of, and demand for, childcare in the Estes Valley (for children aged 0-5) and assessing the business and infrastructure needs of providers. The assessment must include the following:

- Background research and demographic trends in the Estes Valley
  - Estes Park School District R-3 annual enrollment by grades and standardized score results (10 years)
  - Demographic trends over the same period of time including but not limited to age, income, race, education and employment status
  - o Analysis of current full/part time/non-resident home ownership
- Relevant data regarding current and potential consumers of childcare in the Estes Valley.
  - Identification of how you would reach each segment of our potential user population at a statistically-significant rate given the barriers to access of the commuting population and immigration sensitivities of a major residential population segment.
  - o Total number of potential childcare consumers in the Estes Valley (both residents of the valley and commuting employees of valley businesses).
  - Total number of potential RMNP guest drop-in consumers based upon research of drop-in childcare at childcare centers within 10 miles of the top 10 national parks entrances. Identify childcare sources and parks for all data.
  - o For each of the consumer categories, identify the various types of childcare they would choose to participate in (part time/full time, licensed, unlicensed, drop-in, any special night/weekend needs of our tourism industry workers, etc.) and at what cost (cost, in many cases, is a perceived barrier).
  - Detailed analysis of cost, quantity, and quality of existing childcare options in Estes Park including licensed childcare education centers, licensed family childcare providers and unlicensed "Friend / Family" childcare networks
    - This analysis should include but not be limited to:
      - Daily capacity/enrollment

- Hours of operation
- Ages served
- Drop-in care options
- Tuition / rates
- Number and ages of children on waitlist
- Qualifications of staff
- Qualistar Rating
- Programming offered
- Staff compensation / rate of pay
- Funding sources (Colorado Preschool Program (CPP), scholarships, etc.)
- Bilingual instruction
- A data-driven, fully-referenced assessment of the impact to the Estes Valley of inadequate early childhood education/childcare (must cite credible studies and peerreviewed research)
  - o Impacts to the child, family, and community
  - o Impacts to the School District
  - o Impacts to workforce acquisition and retention
- An analysis of the barriers preventing new and/or existing providers from serving the childcare demand in the Estes Valley (segmented by age of child served)
- An analysis of barriers families face in accessing services to support their child's early development.
- Recommendations for next steps to address any identified childcare needs including:
  - Funding options
  - Responsible entities
  - o Implementation timeline

# 4.1 Proposal Submission

# 4.2 Rejection of Proposals

EVICS and Estes Park EDC reserve the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive formalities and minor irregularities in proposals received if deemed in the best interest of EVICS and Estes Park EDC to do so. **LATE PROPOSALS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED OR CONSIDERED**.

### 4.4 Use of Subcontractors

Proposing consultants shall indicate in the proposal any work intended to be performed by subcontractors or persons outside of their firm. The proposing consultant shall name the partner firms, if known, at the time of proposal submittal. Partners and subcontractors shall be bound to meeting the same quality standards and schedules expected of the proposing consultant. Any subcontractors will provide the same level of documentation (insurance and business license) required of the proposing consultant.

#### 4.5 Award of Contract

A formal contact will be awarded to the proposing Consultant whose proposal, conforming to the RFP, will be most advantageous to EVICS and Estes Park EDC.

# 4.6 Insurance Requirements for Consultants

EVICS and Estes Park EDC must approve the successful Consultant's insurance prior to execution of the contract by the EVICS Board and Estes Park EDC Board (insurance certificates are not required with the proposal). The successful Consultant shall acquire a Town Business license prior to signing the contract. Currently the cost is \$200.00.

# 4.7 Response Material Ownership

All material submitted regarding this RFP becomes the property of EVICS and Estes Park EDC and will only be returned to the Consultant at EVICS's and Estes Park EDC's option. EVICS and Estes Park EDC have the right to use any or all ideas presented in reply to this RFP. Disqualification of the proposer does not eliminate this right.

# **5.0 Information Required from Contractor**

# **5.1 Structure of Proposal Response**

The Consultant must provide, in the order they are listed, the following information and statements with the proposal:

- Executive summary of the proposal;
- The Consultant's qualifications and experience in providing professional services in assessing childcare needs or equivalent work;
- The identity of the individual(s) (name, contact information, and title) who would be assigned responsibility for this project (include a resume of his or her experience and qualifications);

- Statement of understanding demonstrating familiarity with the Scope of Work (including schedule);
- Description of the research methodology that will be utilized in gathering the information required by this RFP (including the resources and technology that will be utilized in gathering information);
- Description of the structure and content of the proposed final report;
- A timeline for completion of each phase of the project and the final presentation(s);
- A fee structure and budget for all services and deliverables listed in Section 3.3 (these costs must be itemized for each section of the deliverable).

# 5.2 Response to the RFP

The proposing Consultant must address each item of Section 5.1, in the order presented, and meet the mandatory requirements of Sections 3.0 through 5.0. Proposals should be concise, and generally should not exceed fifteen pages, excluding project experience and assessment history. Proposers must itemize costs for each section of the deliverables. Any requested restrictions for use or inspection of material contained within the submittal shall be clearly stated. Confidential commercial, financial, and/or proprietary information must be clearly identified and separately packaged from the rest of the submittal. If so identified, EVICS and Estes Park EDC will protect those items from disclosure to the extent permitted by law.

#### 5.3 Personnel

The successful Consultant must be capable of providing adequate and knowledgeable personnel to fulfill the requirements of the proposed agreement.

# **6.0 Evaluation/Selection Information**

# **6.1 Evaluation/Selection Method**

A subset of the CSC of Estes Park EDC will evaluate all proposals. The objective of the CSC will be to evaluate the proposals against the following criteria:

- Quality of the proposed plan
- Ingenuity of methods suggested to obtain data and reach citizens from all target demographics in the community
- Prior experience of respondent
- Cost competitiveness to market standards
- References should be provided for at least two (2) recent clients for whom the consultant has performed similar projects.
