Web Accessibility Testing Services

Website design company, Grace Studio LLC, is seeking quotes from firms or individuals who can readily respond to a call for a usability survey on websites that are looking to comply with Section 508 Accessibility Compliance on new websites being developed.

The respondent should be prepared to:

- Design a list of compliance elements to test against, and a 1 - 5 system of ranking each against its accessibility goal. Respondent may refer to W3C's Web Accessibility Initiative - <https://www.w3.org/WAI/intro/people-use-web/>
- Gather three to five individuals who have a diversity of disabilities as listed below and use websites in an accessible fashion for *all* of their work on the web, as testers:
 - » **Auditory** - hard-of-hearing, deaf
 - » **Cognitive & neurological** - autism spectral, ADHD, mental health
 - » **Physical** - amputation, paralysis, muscular dystrophy, reduced dexterity
 - » **Visual** - color blindness, low vision, blindness, deaf-blindness

It is important to the viability of the test results to gather at least one person - ideally two - from each of the categories listed above.

The participants should spend a minimum of two hours on the website, testing the entire site if possible, and noting discrepancies against what they would need to use the website efficiently

- Sum the responses into a report indicating weaknesses or missing elements on the website tested.

Please provide a quote that includes lead time necessary to assemble respondents, the total fee that includes what each respondent would be paid, in addition to your own time in designing, administering and writing your report outlining the conclusions of the survey participants, listing anomalies, and a ranking of the site overall. You may include payment terms in your quote if you like.
