Scope of Services

Podcast 1: Science Journalism (Hot Topics in SfN's Scientific Journals)

Summary

This monthly podcast will feature hot topics published in SfN's two scientific journals, the Journal of Neuroscience and *eNeuro*. This role will work with the Digital Learning & Multimedia and the Digital Strategy teams to book, interview and record on an ongoing freelance basis. A background in science is a must. Additional background in journalism or science communications is ideal.

Basic Format of Podcast:

Each episode should be 10-15 minutes total.

- Introduction to episode
- Introduce guest
- Discussion of the scientific paper
- Summary
- Outro

Science Researcher/Interviewer Production Responsibilities:

- Compile background information on guest(s) and their scientific research as identified by SfN.
- Create interview outlines for review and approval by SfN staff.
- Schedule and conduct pre-interviews, working in conjunction with SfN staff.
- Schedule, conduct, and record interview with guests, working in conjunction with SfN staff.
- Submit finished audio including along with any other necessary background, written transcripts, references and show notes.
- Submit the audio file for staff to review for quality.
- Develop and submit a summary paragraph of the interview to be used in the episode description.

Podcast 2: Nonfiction Storytelling (BrainFacts.org's Inner Cosmos)

Summary:

The human brain is the most complex biological structure in the known universe. The process of scientific discovery has given us what we know as fact today while driving us to seek answers to the unknowns of what will be fact tomorrow. Inner Cosmos, a limited podcast series produced by *BrainFacts.org* at the Society for Neuroscience, will explore the cases that shape our understanding of the brain and ourselves. We're looking for a podcaster that can take an idea and build a story from intro to outro. The podcaster will produce 11 episodes, 15-20mins in duration, for a science curious, lay-friendly audience.

Organizational Information:

BrainFacts.org is a public information initiative of The Kavli Foundation, the Gatsby Charitable Foundation, and the Society for Neuroscience – global nonprofit organizations dedicated to advancing brain research.

Powered by the global neuroscience community and overseen by an editorial board of leading neuroscientists from around the world, *BrainFacts.org* shares the stories of scientific discovery and the knowledge they reveal. Unraveling the mysteries of the brain has the potential to impact every aspect of human experience and civilization.

Basic Format of Podcast:

Each episode should be 15-20 minutes and include the following segments:

- Intro to episode
- Introduction to subject (Host and Podcaster)
- Story Introduction
- Brain Fact
- Interview with Neuroscientist
- Summary
- Outro

Science Researcher/Interviewer Production Responsibilities:

- Research and outline a story arc and narrative based on topics and submitted by the BrainFacts.org staff.
 - o Staff reviews and approves outline and suggested experts for interviews.
- Book experts for interviews and schedule pre-interviews as necessary, and record and conduct all interviews.
- Draft a script to include lines for narrator and host and excerpts from expert interviews.
 - Staff will review and edit script; the podcaster will agree to go through two to three rounds of editing as needed.
- Review final script with the experts interviewed for scientific accuracy.
- After incorporating feedback from experts, mix the podcast according to the script, incorporating intro, outro, and sound palette provided by staff and any other necessary background and environmental sounds.
- Submit the mp3 file for staff to review for quality.
- Deliver final mp3 file with corrections applied as indicated.

Minimum Requirements

Education and Experience:

- Bachelor's Degree in Science, Media & Communications, Journalism and/or related disciplines
- Minimum two years of science communications experience is preferred.
- Experience with associations is a plus

Preferred Qualifications:

- Excellent analytical and conceptual thinking skills to cut through large bodies of research and information to analyze summarize and develop arguments
- Understand the relationships between theory and practice, data and trends, and can think in an inter-disciplinary way
- Ability to read and assess academic research from various applications of neuroscience
- Excellent organizational skills to work independently and productively in a fast-paced environment and the ability to see projects through from start to finish
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills to successfully and effectively liaise with a variety of stakeholders
- Ability to make complex information relevant to a scientific community at a minimum undergraduate level
